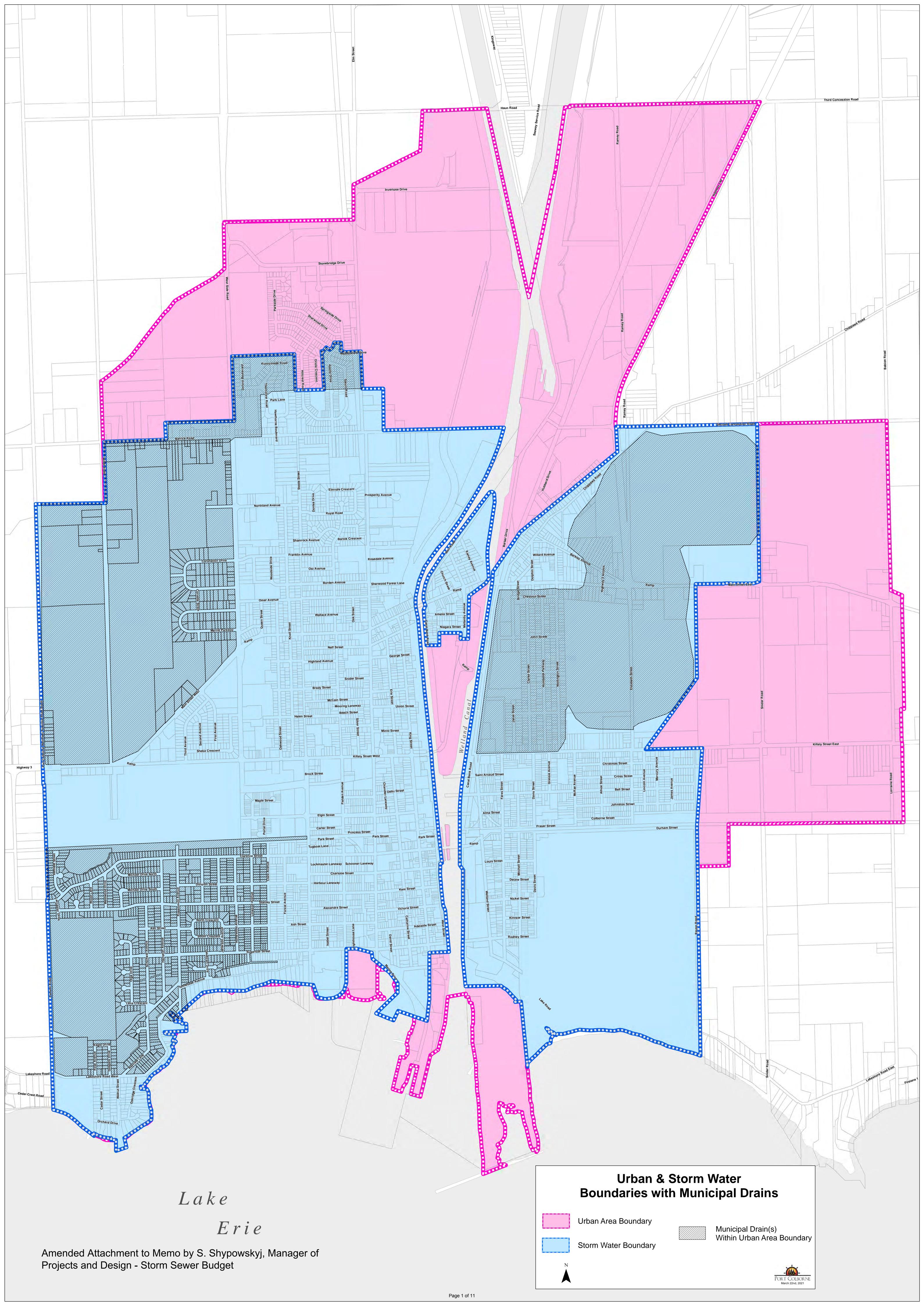

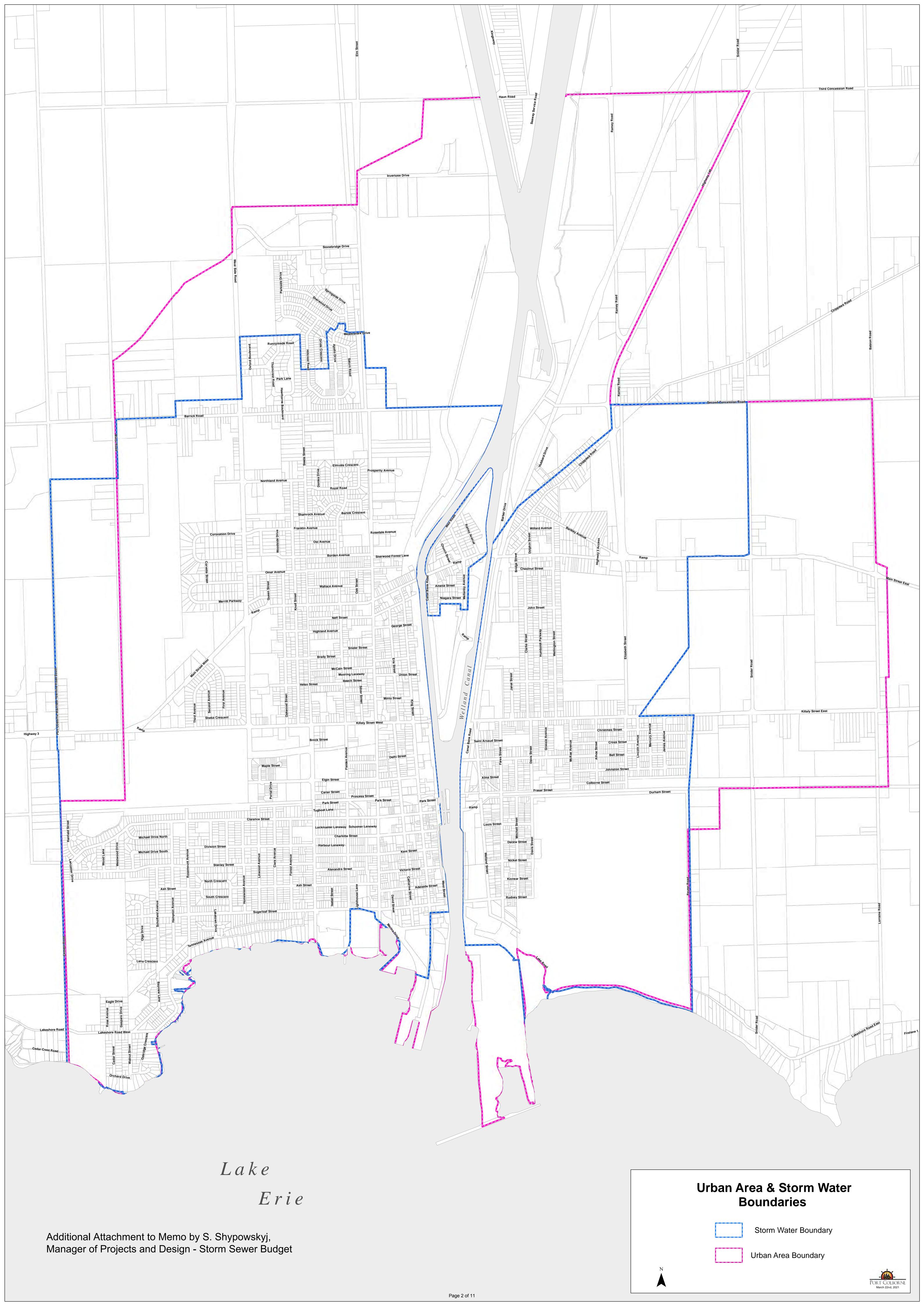

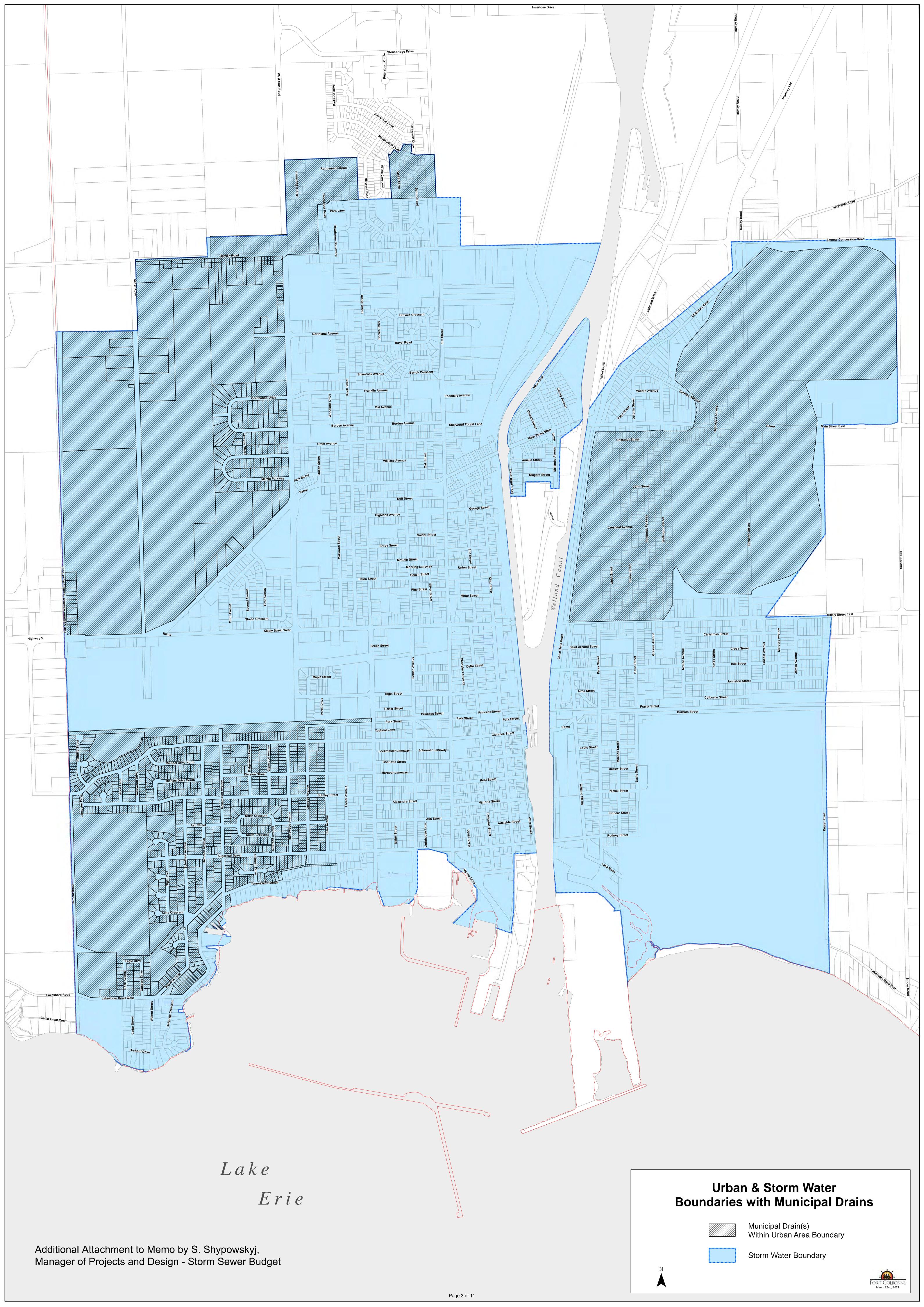

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Why, How, What, Who, and When

Why does Port Colborne need a strategic plan?

- growth, development, and change
- new issues, challenges, opportunities, emerging trends
- shift focus from day-to-day to being future-ready
- shared vision, mission, key priorities to provide strategic focus to move City forward
- coordinated/consistent approach to service delivery
- line of sight for staff and organizational alignment to deliver on Council priorities
- inform decisions and allocate resources



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How did we get here?

- Facilitated roundtable discussions with Council and staff in 2019 and early 2020
- Development of key themes, vision and mission statements, strategic priorities, and action items
- project postponed in March 2020 due to COVID
- revisited in fall 2020
- further discussions with Councillors and senior staff



What are the key components?

• To provide an exceptional small-town experience in a big way



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Corporate Values:

Integrity – we interact with others ethically and honourably

Pillars of Sustainability

- committed to accountability and transparency and keeping Council and community informed through quarterly updates on strategic plan progress
