From his commissioning in 1914, he becomes an observer and then wins his wings as a fighter pilot, and by 1918, is involved in the deadly air combat over the front lines.

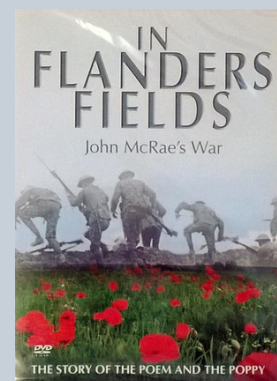


#### John McCrae's War, In Flanders Fields

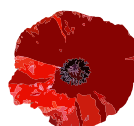
Follow poet John McCrae, from his childhood in Ontario to his years in medicine at McGill University and the WWI battlefields of

Belgium, where he cared for wounded soldiers. McCrae and Alexis Helmer—the young man whose death inspired the poem—have faded from memory.



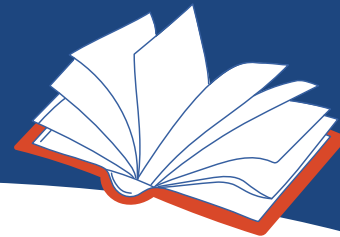
### WEAR A POPPY WITH PRIDE
